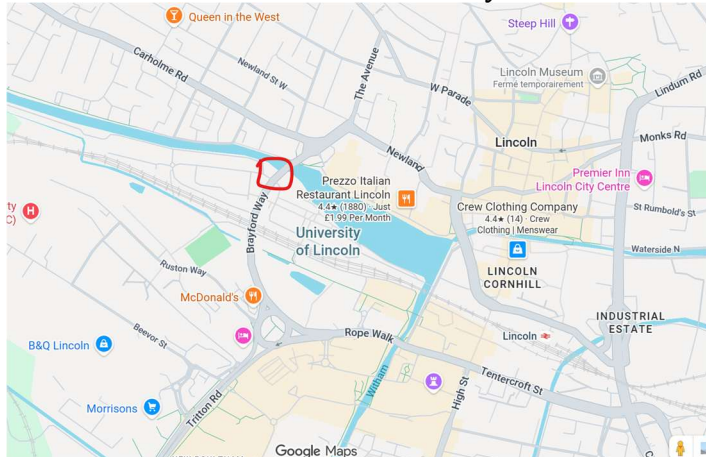

1. Class

I had: Sport, culture and Society: super interesting as sport is my passion, the teacher was so nice and very involved in our learning. The assessment was a pre-recording presentation of 25mn.

International Business Environment : the most difficult in my opinion because topics are deep and the module covers many things (Globalisation, FDI, free trade areas, outsourcing, competitive advantages...). Assessment was one report (2000 words) and one essay (1500 words)

Principles of Project Management: very interesting but the teaching was not the best, assessment was one report about a project we had to do in team (2500 words).

Leadership and High Performance Teams: one of my favourite, topics were so relevant and different, was very involved in it. Assessments were two essays of 1500 words each.

2. Organization of the Class

Each class is divided into lectures and seminars and are 1 hour class. So it's super quick and you don't lose interest. But you have a lot of documentation to read. So it's very interesting and teachers have a lot of experience, but you need to work on your own beside.

I definitely recommend this one if you love sports, and that you want to speak about it. This one was with 20 students, it's like TD in France.

International Business Environment : the most difficult in my opinion because topics are deep and the module covers many things (Globalisation, FDI, free trade areas, outsourcing, competitive advantages...). So you need to be very focused, there is one hour as a lecture (amphitheatre) and one hour as a seminar (TD).

Principles of Project Management: very interesting but the teaching was not the best. Same schedule as international business environment. We had to lead a project in team, and do a presentation about it which was not graded but it was the core of the report for the assessment. Would recommend it, it is like the following of the management class in MOMA L3IM

Leadership and High Performance Teams: one of my favourite, topics were so relevant and different, was very involved in it. The two essays were on analysing leadership style in a certain context, so many analysis and a lot of different discussions and topics.

4. Exam

Assessments are reports, essays, of 1500-2000 words, AI is forbidden. Grade is out of 100. And for each one, you received a feedback telling you what was good and what was wrong to improve the next time. But it can also be a pre-recording presentation, 25mn long. Here almost only scientific/math classes have an exam at the end of the semester.
