A. Preparation

Visa

I needed to open a German bank account, as the student housing don't accept any other account than a German one, even if it's a French one. I opened an account with N26, but I would do things differently and open one directly to a traditional bank, to get a 'Girocard' as they are more accepted than Mastercard or Visa there. Even to charge your laundry card you have to use these (so I had to ask friends all the time).

Help: What insurance did you subscribe to?


Nothing much than the one I have in France.

So we had one dorm assigned called Filderbahnplatz, it's a nice area (15 minutes with the U Bahn from the city center, and 25 minutes from the University. It's not my favorite area of the city but you live 100m away from the U bahn station.

It's expensive in Germany, I paid 50€ for 120GB per month, but you have cheaper ones. For internet in the dorms, you pay 7€ per months and you have it activated in your room (they explain it when you sign up to the dorms) and I would wait to get there to buy a router as someone might have left it in the room.

Help: How to know about the events?


Because of strict covid regulations in Germany there was nothing officially planned by the Erasmus network. Just things between me and the friends I made there.

E. Eating


Help: Any recommendation? Or good tips (e.g. aninternational house buffet) For traditional German food you have:

- -Munich it's nice (do the Olympic Park, the BMW museum, the English garden...)
- -Tübingen, which is 1 hours away by regional trains, and is super nice for a day trip
- -Heidelberg, also nice for a day trip, but is slightly further away
- -Europa Park, I went there with German friends by car, but I believe you can also take a FlixBus there
- -Berlin for a few days
- -Hamburg, you can get there after your Berlin trip as it's 2 hours away from Berlin
- -Zurich
- -The South of Germany for a hiking weekend
- -Everything in Stuttgart (museums, viewpoints, parks...)

I haven't been to a place in Germany/nearby that I would not recommend visiting.

H. Any other information you would have liked to know about

To know a little bit of German before going there, as you will have German classes, but at the beginning you might end up in a situation where the person don't speak English at all...

Also to always have cash on you, as a lot of places are cash only (compared to France it's really surprising), you might be at a restaurant and when you want to pay they are like cash only or (Girocards (German cards)) only. The same goes for bars and clubs, they are most of the time cash only.
