
I got the European health insurance card from my Ameli account. [Help: What insurance did you subscribe to?]

# A. Inscription at the university

# B. Information on the university

#### 1. Class

Organizational change: was an interesting class which talked about different approaches to management of change and the different types of organizational culture in companies. What I didn't like was that it was very early (8am) but I really liked the content of the course. I would recommend it for another student.

Semiotics of advertising: really nice class the teacher has a nice way of explaining. Wasn't a very hard course, it is a way of understanding advertisements through signs, so we look deep in the thinking of how these ads were created. I really liked the course because in the exam we had to choose an ad and explain how they used signs to attract customers and it made me understand a lot on how marketing teams worked. Nothing to dislike in this course would recommend to another student.

Cross cultural communication in Management: I really liked this class from the teacher which comes from the United States with a really good English. The class was about how companies are able to succeed after opening branches abroad and different strategies to follow. Very nice course the teacher made sure we were always keeping up with the course which was helpful for the exam. What I disliked was that we had homework and tests almost every 2 weeks. But the course ended earlier than others, I would recommend it to another student.

Human resource management: Not my favorite course, I had to choose it because it was the best among others, but it is basic human resource studies which we had already seen at MOMA wasn't very complicated. The only problem was that the course started very late from 6:30pm till 8pm. It depends on the student if they really want to take this course.

An Introduction to Visual Culture Studies: if I could go back in time I would probably change this course because the teacher didn't speak good English and was reading the entire course from her papers without stopping or just make us watch a video for 15min every time. It was about historic topics and analysis of visual arts of the history or big moments like the covid for example. I would not recommend it to another student.

Risk, money and decision making: probably my favorite course, learnt a lot from it, it talks about how to take decisions in life, regarding jobs, or any type of dilemma, different type of ways of thinking. Very interesting course with a really charismatic teacher which made the course even more interesting. I would recommend it to another student. Nothing wrong to say about this course.

Cross cultural communication in Management: a lot of work to do in this course but wasn't very hard, I liked how we learnt the strategies if we wanted to open a business abroad, what kind of difficulties we would have to face with the culture difference. With professor Marvee Marr. I would recommend the course.

Human resource management: easy class, I liked the way of explaining of the teacher helps understand better the course using kahoots and communication. Class every Tuesday from 6:30pm till 8pm with professor Wioleta Karna. I would recommend the course.

An Introduction to Visual Culture Studies: easy course, the content could be interesting with a little more interaction from the teacher because it talks about a lot of important topics from history. Class every Wednesday from 11:30am till 1pm with professor Anna Folta-Rusin. Wouldn't recommend the course to another student.

Risk, money and decision making: not too hard of a course, I really liked the way the teacher explained and interacted with us, and the course was really interesting helped me change the way of thinking in different situations. Class every Friday from 11:30am till 1pm with Professor Mateusz Polak. I would recommend the course to another student.

Cross cultural communication in Management was a mix of a final presentation, 3 written tests along the semester, presence in class, and criticizing of the presentation of other students. Grade: 4.5/5 (credits)

Human resource management was an online MCQ exam to complete in 1h30min. Grade 5/5 (credits)

An Introduction to Visual Culture Studies was an essay to give back by the end of the semester where we had to pick two topics seen in class and analyze and compare them. Grade 4/5 (credits)

Risk, money and decision making was an MCQ test to complete in 1h. Grade 3.5/5 (credits)
