II. Before the travel

A. Preparation

1. Visa

I needed a Visa so that I could travel to Mexico. First I had to store the necessary documents I saw on the internet after searching on the official government website, then I had to go to the embassy of Belgium to get my Visa.

2. The flight

I took my flight 3/4 months before the before departure date, with Turkish airlines. I had a layover on the way there for 3 hours and on the way back for 20 hours, and for both of the flights, I used the International airport of Benito Juarez.

3. My luggage

The exams there are different from those in France, you have to take them in three times where the first two times count for 30% and the last for 40%. exams last about a week or sometimes more. The exams are based on 3 points: a teacher's evaluation, a self-evaluation, and a co-evaluation where you have to evaluate other students. In general, it wasn't as hard as I thought it would be.

A. Safety

It is very safe to live in Pachuca because it's a small city but since I'm a girl I preferred to avoid going out or taking public transport at night after 10/11 p.m.

B. Phone and Internet

To be able to call and have internet, you have to subscribe to the « Travel option » or if you don't have it I recommend Revolut card.

C. Events

About the events, I got added in the WhatsApp of the university what left me up to date.

D. Sports

As a boy you can do Football there because the city is known for football, it even has one of the best football museum. And personally as a girl I just used the gym of the university for sports.

E. Eating

For the food there I do not recommend eating in the stands outside except when it comes to small specialties of the country or state in which you live, personally I recommend trying the chilaquiles which are a breakfast typical, quesadillas and tacos. Finally, you should definitely not drink tap water.

F. Go to the university: bus, car, bike

To use public transport it's very easy there, you just have to ask at the start at each of the little buses if they pass by the desired place and memorize them. then for the tickets: for small buses payment is made in cash directly in the bus at the end of the trip, and for large buses there is a small machine where you have to pay to get your ticket.

G. Travels

I recommend to travel and discover because there is a lot of things to see, and to negotiate because sometimes they tend to want to rip off tourists, and what I do not recommend is to Go out very late at night in the capital.
