II. Before the travel

A. Preparation

1. Visa

Yes, I needed a visa because I don't have a French passport. The process involved submitting an application at the Mexican consulate, providing proof of enrollment, financial stability, and a valid passport. It took about two weeks to receive the visa.

2. The flight

I flew with Turkish Airlines from Luxembourg Airport to Mexico City International Airport. I booked my flight ticket three months in advance to get a better price. It costed around 800 euros for a round-trip one.


I subscribed to a comprehensive travel insurance plan that covered health, travel, and personal belongings, it's called heyme.

4. Exam

A. Safety
