I. Your overall feeling after your semester abroad

My experience abroad was wonderful because I came across incredible people and I visited breath-taking places that I could not have seen otherwise. The campus is really great, with all necessary amenities, and courses and teaching staff are perfect.

II. Before the travel

A. Preparation

1. Visa

No Visa required, unless you come from a non-EU country.

2. The flight

I took a Ryanair flight, thank to the ESN card, we can have 10% cut on the flight price and a free 20kg suitcase on-board. Hence, I paid around 100€ (with 2 suitcases and a backpack) for the first flight to reach Dublin, because I took it at the last minute. Nevertheless, we can find less expensive flights.

My luggage

Since the accommodation is equipped enough, no need to focus on anything else than clothes and bedsheets if you are not willing to pay $25 \in$ for those provided by the village.

4. Bank account

If you have a french bank account already, no need to change anything since the Euro is also Ireland's currency. Otherwise I have no idea.


5. Insurance

I was under the European health insurance protection thanks to the European Health Insurance card I asked to the "Sécurité Sociale" website (Amélie) and delivered within 10 days.

B. Housing

1. Where to live

If you can, you HAVE to choose Kilmurry village as your accommodation. The village is the cutest, especially when the weather is sunny, you are next to the UL Beach, next to the UL sport facilities (gym, tennis courts, running tracks etc.) and the ambiance is the best on the campus. That is where I personally met most of my friends, hopefully it will be the same for you!



2. Find a flat or a room

Once you are accepted into the University, there is no need to panic, every information will be provided by mail and it is crystal clear. You shall not have any issue finding your oncampus accommodation.

Cost

That is the worst part about Irish accommodations: it is extremely expensive. I personally had to pay 780€/month to have a room in a 6 room house in Kilmurry. Nevertheless, some accommodations are a bit cheaper but I would not recommend them since they are very far from the campus' life (Thomond, Troy etc.)

III. When I arrive at the university

A. Inscription at the university

Once again there is no particularity in the inscription process, everything is detailed into mails, and the international student department is extremely active and supporting.

B. Information on the university

1. Class

I had 5 courses:

- *International Tax* --> *Advise you to take it, every courses are online and the teacher is the nicest most helpful person ever, it was a pleasure.*
- Marketing Communications --> Advise you to take it, the teacher put a lot of energy into his class and you would not be willing to miss this show + he is adorable and half of the final grade is a group work.
- **Empirical Finance** --> Would not advise you to take it, the teacher is great but I do not like finance and it is not any better in Ireland than it is in France.
- **Foundations of Aircraft Leasing** --> Advise you to take it, the whole final grade is based on 2 homework with way enough time to realize them so no worries.
- Air transportation --> Advise you to take it, every courses are online and the teacher is the nicest most helpful person ever, it was a pleasure.

2. Organization of the Class

Each class lasts 1 hour maximum, so you might have around 15 hours of course each week, sometimes even less.

3. List of courses and recommendation

(cf. 1. for pros and cons), International Tax was kind of new so nothing to compare with into MoMa, Marketing Communications was way more interesting and pleasant in Ireland, it was not hard, Empirical Finance was just as hard as in MoMa, Foundations of Aircraft Leasing was medium hard and Air Transportation was easy.

4. Exam

Exam are either 2,5h long or under 1h long, but for must subjects it does not count for the whole grade since there are a lot of homework which makes it possible to have good grades all along the semester.

IV. When I life there

A. Safety

The campus is safe, you should nevertheless close your windows if you can watch the place because there has been an incident.

B. Phone and Internet

There is an on-campus free internet connexion, if you go out of the campus there is 4G almost everywhere in the country, you will just have to use your foreign data but it should be specified in your operator contract.

C. Events

Bond with people, follow @ul_studentlife; @ulglobal and @universityoflimerick on Instagram and you will not miss anything.

D. Sports

There are plenty of sport clubs and associations on the campus, what you can do is go on the US Wolves website and see what you like. You just have to pay a small amount and you are into the club/association.

E. Eating

Go to Lidl or Aldi, it is the less expensive. There are on-campus places to eat but it is neither really cheap nor good.

F. Go to the university: bus, car, bike

You can walk, or rent a bike, but everything is pretty close. To reach the city center, you should take the bus nearby Stables (the campus bar). To pay less, you have to order a Leap Card once you arrive into the country, it will make you save A LOT of money.

G. Travels

The country is wonderful and no matter where you go, you will be breath-taken. Just go with the flow! Nevertheless, you should not miss the cliffs of Moher or the Giant Causeway in Northern Ireland, those are absolutely divines.
